How do we create authentic opportunities for students to show what they know and apply their learning?



### What is Informal Education?

Informal education takes place outside of formal classroom learning. It is self-guided, student-centered, inquiry-based and can be spontaneous.














#### Literacy in Motion Spring to Fall Growth










# Scale Score Growth LIM vs. Non LIM- 2nd Grade



## Kind-Henest Feedback that Fecuses on the work, not the student

- > I really like the way...
- > I enjoyed reading this because...
- > You did a really great job with...

# Specific – zoom in on the details and offer specific advice for improving them

- I think this part could use a bit more detail or explaining.
- This part was difficult to understand or was unclear because...

# Helpful- explain why the advice is helpful by adding a 'so that' on to whatever is suggested

- Try working on...so that...
- Try adding/changing...so that...
- Perhaps you could...so that...








